Many businesses either don't understand OSHA's Process Safety Management standard (PSM), or they don't realize it applies to them. Once you have determined you have a covered process or on-site storage, handling and/or moving of a highly hazardous chemical (defined by 29 CFR 1910.119) at or above the threshold quantity set by OSHA, you must develop a PSM program compliant with OSHA's specific requirements.
