All IEP goals should be SMART goals, an acronym that refers to goals as specific, measurable, achievable, results-oriented, and time-bound. A SMART IEP goal will be realistic for the student to achieve and lay out how the student will accomplish it. Breaking down the components of SMART goals into their specific elements can make them easier to write.

Objectives to support IEP Writing Goals. Write the main idea with some supporting details on a topic. Research and write to convey understanding of a topic using at least one resource. Write clear, focused main ideas and supporting details on a topic.

IEP goals shouldn't be vague or general. A SMART IEP goal will say when and how often your child's progress will be measured. It's important for IEP goals to be stated in a way that can be measured by standardized tests, curriculum-based measurements or screening.

Developing IEP Goals for Writing As with goals in any content area, growth in the area of written expression needs to be determined first by establishing a baseline. This can be done using writing prompts, fluency probes and spelling word lists as well as other standardized, standard based and curriculum designed assessments.

Writing Measurable Annual Goals Measurable annual goals are statements that describe what a child with a disability can reasonably be expected to accomplish within a 12-month period in the child's education program. There should be a direct relationship between the measurable annual goals and the needs identified in the PLAAFP.

While reading a passage orally, STUDENT will demonstrate self-correcting of errors by pausing in the text, using context clues and phonetic skills, and then rereading the phrase for meaning 90% accuracy 4 of 5 trials. While reading orally, STUDENT will demonstrate reading fluency by making no more than 2 errors in a one hundred word passage at instructional level 4 of 5 trials.

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Writing Effective IEP Goals January 1, 2019 Central to the creation of the Individualized Education Program (IEP) by the IEP team, is development of measurable annual goals, which are based on a student's current levels of academic and functional performance, and which should align to and reference the Pennsylvania standards.

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
